Please use the guidelines on the next two pages to help you provide appropriate information for your nomination. The Performance Awards will be judged primarily on their achievements over the past twelve months – June 2011-May 2012. The Service and Provision Awards will be judged on wider engagement with the community.

A Judging Panel representative of sport in the Borough will judge the nominations received for the Sutton Celebrating Sport Awards.

Please note that nominations for the individual categories cannot be from the nominee themselves or members of their immediate family.

The names of everyone who sends in a nomination will be entered into a prize draw to win £100 of sports vouchers. The prize draw will take place at the Celebrating Sport Awards on 12 July.

The closing date for nominations is Friday 1st June.

For all the junior categories the Judging Panel will draw up shortlists that will be published on the website mid-late June and there will then be a week when people will be able to vote via text for their preferred nominee in each of these categories. The number of votes will be combined with the Judging Panel's scores to determine the winners.

Sportsperson of the Year, sponsored by Sutton Guardian Open to individuals that live or train within the London Borough of Sutton, are 18 or over on 31st August 2012 and who have represented their country at their chosen sport.	Think about what this person has achieved over the last 12 months, and how they are a good role model for aspiring young sportspeople in the Borough.
Disabled Sportsperson of the Year Open to individuals that live, go to school or train within the London Borough of Sutton.	Think about what this person has achieved over the last 12 months, and how they are a good role model for aspiring young disabled sportspeople in the Borough.
Junior Sportsperson of the Year sponsored by Carshalton College Open to individuals that live or go to school in the London Borough of Sutton, are under 18 on 31st August 2012, and have represented their county or reached a higher level in their chosen sport.	Think about what this young person has achieved over the last 12 months, how they demonstrate their commitment to their chosen sport(s), and how they are a good role model for aspiring young sportspeople in the Borough.
Senior Team of the Year Open to teams (where the majority of the members are 18 or over on 31st August 2012) from clubs and other sporting organisations based within the London Borough of Sutton.	Think about what the team has achieved over the last 12 months, and their contribution to the club, in terms of their commitment and success.
Junior Team of the Year Open to club and school teams from the London Borough of Sutton with all the members being under 18 on 31st August 2012.	Think about what the team has achieved over the last 12 months, and their contribution to their club or school, in terms of their commitment and success.
Sports Teacher of the Year (Schools) Open to Sports Teachers in both Primary and Secondary Schools within the London Borough of Sutton.	Think about the Sports Teacher's contribution in areas such as encouraging more people to participant in sport and how they have used their skills and innovative ideas to engage all pupils to participate in PE and School Sport. Also, think about what sets them apart from other sports teachers and the qualities and values they demonstrate that makes them a role model and monter.

GUIDELINES FOR NOMINATIONS

Club of the Year, sponsored by Sutton Sports Council

Open to clubs located within the London Borough of Sutton and clubs located just outside the



borough boundaries where at least 50% of its members are London Borough of Sutton residents. The club must have achieved accreditation (Clubmark or their NGB equivalent).

Think about what the club has achieved in areas such as junior development, volunteer management and developing links with local schools and presenting a really positive image for its sport.

Coach of the Year, sponsored by, Sutton Chamber of Commerce

Open to individuals who are involved with an organisation within the London Borough of Sutton and who hold a recognised coaching qualification.



Think about the coach's contribution in areas such as encouraging more people to participate in that sport or activity, helping people to improve their skills and their level of sporting performance. Also think about how the coach has looked to improve their own coaching performance.

Volunteer of the Year

Open to individuals involved with a school, sports club or other sporting organisation within the London Borough of Sutton in an unpaid capacity.

Think about the volunteer's contribution in areas such as encouraging more people to participate in sport, and how they have used their skills and innovative ideas for the benefit of the organisation. Also, think about what sets them apart from other people and the qualities and values they demonstrate that makes them a role model for others in terms of presenting a really positive image for their organisation.

Junior Volunteer of the Year

Open to individuals who are involved with a school, sports club or other sporting organisation within the London Borough of Sutton in an unpaid capacity and who are at least 7 years old and under 18 on 31st August 2012.

Think about the young person's contribution to their organisation in areas such as encouraging more people to participate in sport or activity and helping people to improve their skills and their level of sporting performance. Also, think about the young person's commitment to their own personal development, and the qualities and values they demonstrate that makes them a role model for other young people in terms of presenting a really positive image for their organisation.

Sporting Primary School of the Year, sponsored by Sutton Tennis Academy

Open to primary schools within the London Borough of Sutton.



Think about the work/initiatives that have had a significant impact on the PE and school sport within the school and how this has in turn led to a positive impact for the pupils. Think also about how the school engages with the local community and encourages all pupils of all abilities to participate in PE and School Sport.

Sporting Secondary School of the Year, sponsored by SLM/Everyone Active

Open to secondary schools within the London Borough of Sutton.
